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## President's Corner

Cape Hatteras National Seashore **Recreational Area** was established as "Americas first Recreational National Park" a place where all Americans and our visitors could enjoy the beauties and recreational opportunities on the Outer-banks of North Carolina. Pea Island National Wildlife Refuge was carved from the heart of this **Recreational Area** and is managed/mismanaged for the benefit of the native flora, fauna and visitors. While we have had to accept the creation of Pea Island National Wildlife Refuge, we cannot accept the continuing efforts of those who would change Cape Hatteras National Seashore **Recreational Area** into another or enlarged wildlife refuge with no consideration for the documented cultural resources being denied to the current residents, multigenerational resident families and visitors, resources that provided for

cultural traditions that long predate the arrival of the National Park Service.

**Traditional Cultural Properties (TCP's)** are afforded protection under the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as Amended. The National Park Service National Register Bulletin, Guidelines for Evaluating and Documenting Traditional Cultural Properties (rev. 1998), definitions of TCP's include: 1) A rural community whose organization, buildings and structures, or patterns of land use reflect the cultural traditions valued by its long term residents; and 2) A location where a community has traditionally carried out economic artistic or other cultural practices important in maintaining its historic identity. These definitions of a TCP clearly and fully apply to the Cape Hatteras National Seashore Recreational Area beaches and their historical and contemporary public use.

For too long the NPS has ignored as a cultural resource, the lands within Cape Hatteras National Seashore Recreational Area while giving primacy to the natural resource concerns. We do not and have never wished harm to any resource and in fact have truly acted as stewards to insure the preservation of the natural beauties within these lands and waters. It is now time for the NPS to recognize as TCP's, the landscapes and their historic patterns of use not only help maintain the traditional identity of Outer Banks communities (themselves unique cultural entities) but that these same communities have historically been shaped by the long standing use of the beach landscapes accessed by motorized, personal vehicles. Outer Banks culture has historically been inextricably tied to the surf zone and remains so today. The surf zone has traditionally sustained the island economy and culture through com-

mercial fishing, recreational fishing and tourism. These activities have been ongoing for more than 50 years and are therefore of historic age and potentially eligible for protection under the National Historic Preservation Act.

We (NCBBA, OBPA, CHAC & many others) have asked the North Carolina Office of Archives and History, North Carolina State Historic Preservation Office to review and recognize the inlets, spits and adjoining beaches of Cape Hatteras National Seashore Recreational Area as TCP potentially eligible to the National Register of Historic Places. With the recognition that vehicular access to these places is necessary to maintain the traditions associated with the Outer Banks and this "The First Recreational National Park".

The first review is scheduled for November and we will keep you informed of the progress.

## New Seashore Chief Ranger

*Superintendent Mike Murray invited the recently selected Chief Ranger, Paul Stevens, to write a guest article for the NCBBA newsletter article this month. Many NCBBA members know Paul Stevens casually but this provides an opportunity for an in-depth article on Paul's background and work history. Superintendent Murray will resume his usual written correspondence with the next NCBBA issue.*

"My first memories of Cape Hatteras were vacationing with my family in Avon in the early 1960's. My father rented a "beach box" on pilings and we would load up the car, including the box fans for the windows. A highlight of the week's vacation was gathering around a beach fire. We would collect driftwood for several days and enjoy a beach fire towards the end of the week. It is great to see families continue to enjoy this practice.

After several years coming to Avon in the 1960's, my father was transferred from the Pentagon where he worked as an officer in the Judge Advocate General's Office to Lajes Field, Azores, where he served as the base Staff Judge Advocate. Living in the Azores was a great time in my life and I learned many things from the different cultures. The Portuguese are very gracious people.

After almost three years overseas, my father was transferred back to Washington, D.C. and stationed in the Forrestal Building where the U.S. Air Force's Judge Advocate General's Office was located. In 1970, my father decided to retire from his Air Force career and our family moved to Greenville, NC.

My next experience with visiting the Cape Hatteras National Seashore was in high school.

My high school friends and I would pile in a car and drive down on weekends and camp at Cape Point and Frisco Campgrounds. This was also my first encounter with a park ranger. I was given a verbal warning for riding my skateboard in the campground. This was also probably the first time I thought about becoming a park ranger. What sparked my interest the most was working in the great outdoors and the fact that national parks provide such a great opportunity and place for people to actually work in such a great place....like the Seashore!

I entered East Carolina University in 1979 and began to figure out what studies were of interest to me. I finally decided to major in Parks and Conservation Management which could not have been a choice and complemented my interests in the state and national park systems.

I tried repeatedly to get a seasonal park ranger job with the NPS in the summers between semesters, with no luck. Since I'd "had my fill" of working in cucumber and tobacco fields in junior and senior high school, I decided to apply for seasonal Park Attendant jobs with N.C. State Parks. I worked at Goose Creek State Park in Beaufort County and Carolina Beach State Park the following summer.

Building on the experience of those two summers in the State Park system, the summer of 1983 I completed my college degree by working as an intern at Cape Lookout National Seashore. At the end of the internship, I was determined to become a National Park Service (NPS) Park Ranger.

My first winter out of college I landed a seasonal park ranger job with the NPS at Congaree Swamp National Monument in South Carolina.

Great park and good people. It was a six month temporary position.

After Congaree, I applied for a permanent park ranger position with N.C. State Parks at Fort Fisher State Recreation Area and Bald Head Island State Preserve. I was hired into this position in the spring of 1984. After a couple of years working these parks, I was hired in my first NPS position at Moores Creek National Battlefield in Currie, NC near Wilmington, NC. In 1987, I was promoted into a higher graded park ranger position back at Congaree and during the fall of 1988, I requested a "compassion transfer" to Cape Hatteras National Seashore in order to be closer to my mother who had terminal cancer.

I moved into my government mobile home at Wright Brothers National Memorial Thanksgiving week of 1988. It was a bittersweet move since my mother passed away on Thanksgiving Day.

The main reason I left the permanent State Park ranger job and transferred to the NPS was to be able to work in different parks around the country and my entire career has been in North and South Carolina. This is not a bad thing at all, just the way things work out.

My philosophy regarding law enforcement issues in the parks is in-line with NPS philosophy: use the lowest effective level of law enforcement to correct the problem. Give a warning if that is sufficient to ensure compliance. Write a ticket if necessary. Make an arrest if needed to keep the situation, or to keep the violator from hurting themselves or others.

Another important aspect of protecting park resources is working with organizations such as the NCBBA. We have approximately 70 miles

of beach to patrol and even when fully staffed, our rangers cannot cover the entire Seashore adequately. Dare County Communications can be reached at 252-473-3444 to report non-emergency violations, such as entering a closed area. For life threatening emergencies, persons should always use 911. In addition, the Dare County Crime Line can be called at 252-473-3111 or 1-800-745-2736 to report criminal activity in the parks and you can remain anonymous. Dare County Crime Line will also award up to \$1,000, for information leading to the arrest of person(s) that have committed crimes in Cape Hatteras National Seashore, Fort Raleigh National Historic Site and Wright Brothers National Memorial.

Working my way up the ranger ranks here at Cape Hatteras has been a great experience. Now don't think there have not been some trying times, overall it's been great. The unique thing about this group of parks is each area is different in its own way. The seashore is almost like three small parks when you look at the three districts of Bodie Island, Hatteras Island, and Ocracoke Island.

In closing, many career park rangers have always had a "dream park" where we would like to spend time. I feel very lucky to have spent most of my career at one of my "dream parks" which is Cape Hatteras National Seashore. We have many challenges here in dealing with the Consent Decree, completing the ORV management plan, staffing, etc. I am fortunate to be working with an outstanding management team and a dedicated staff of Park Rangers. I can assure you as Chief Ranger, I will work with our team and the neighboring community for a positive outcome to many of our challenges.

# Secretary's Report: Highlights of Board Meeting: June 13, 2009

President Jim Keene called the meeting to order at 8:11AM. Board members not present were Allen Fredd, Mike Metzgar and Dave Joyner. Other members in attendance were Tommy Jordan #9797.

President Jim Keene welcomed new Board member Shelly Bembridge who will be handling Operation Beach Respect and announced Allen Fredd has agreed to take over fundraising. Mike McNichol was welcomed as our new Editor.

Director Carol Mowers made the motion to accept the minutes from the March 14, 2009 BOD meeting. Director Dave Goodwin seconded. Motion passed and the minutes were approved as written.

Treasurer Brenda Outlaw submitted the Financial report for the Pig Pickin-Annual Meeting. The current checking account balance is \$30,230.15. Director Dave Goodwin made the motion to accept the Treasurer's report. Director Lew Spangler seconded. Motion passed.

President Jim Keene reported on the status of the budget. Our income is down as well as our expenses from last year. New membership is only at 40 percent from last year. Contributions are in good shape. Contribution still needs to be made to the Friends of Youth.

Director Mowers reported she met with Pat Cahill to go over soliciting vendors to support the Red Drum Tournament program book. She will start soliciting ads in July from vendors who supported the program book last year.

## Editorial

Cape Hatteras National Seashore Recreational Area is, as I hope you are aware, under attack by misguided environmental groups that has led to unprecedented beach closures. One of these groups, the Audubon Society was instrumental in these closings. It has come to my attention that Toyota has provided a 20 million dollar donation to Audubon, the largest donation ever made to the Audubon Society. Undoubtedly this donation helped with the legal funding that has led to these beach closures. I regrettably own a Tundra 4WD from Toyota which I purchased so I could pull my camper to and from Cape Hatteras and drive the previously open beaches for fishing and

pleasure. I personally will not buy another Toyota product, nor will I recommend them in light of this revelation.

Our beaches have always been subject to closures to protect wildlife in accordance with National Park Service regulations. These new closures are based on unfounded "scientific" claims without regard to the consequences to the people who live and visit here.

Let's take a similar situation with regard to migrating right whales. NOAA currently advises ships along the migration route to reduce speed to 10 knots and be on the lookout for these endangered whales, a reasonable request. If we leave

this to the Audubon Society, Southern Environmental Law Center, et al. to devise regulations to protect the whales, ports up and down the Atlantic Seaboard would close during the migration season or ships would be routed far out to sea to avoid these whales at millions of dollars in additional cost. Reasonable people would certainly consider this untenable. Cape Hatteras National Seashore Recreational Area is a microcosm of this scenario, millions of dollars lost and thousands of jobs threatened to protect some species of birds that are not endangered or even threatened and in fact are thriving on the nearby islands in the Pamlico Sound.

Reasonable protections are needed and have been in place for years. Toyota's funding has enabled these groups to use the Federal Courts to do their bidding instead of reasoned deliberate protections. NCBBA has been of particular help to NPS in keeping the beaches clean with several beach cleanups each year and its many members advised on resource protection and safe driving rules. Please let Toyota know of your concern. I am sorely disappointed that my recent purchase of a 2008 Toyota has inadvertently helped close the beaches I have enjoyed for many years.

# Fishing Report

by John Newbold #14



Well, well, well, big bluefish did arrive this spring on the Outer Banks after all, and I had the misfortune to hook up with and promptly pull off two of them in the same day. Back in the day when that fish made it's great spring and fall runs, we fished with mono line and fiberglass rods that were more forgiving and flexible than the braided line and graphite rods we use today. The key is to set the drag to a softer or looser setting and let the fish run just a bit before putting on the heat!

No doubt, Joanie Canipe, #9861, and her friends already knew this because they cleaned house with a win, place and show at the recent Nags Head Surf Fishing Club's annual member tournament. The girls hooked about ten fish in all, pulled off several during the landings, but did manage to hook, fight and land three nice 10 to 12 pound blues that let them sweep the tournament. They were fishing at Oregon Inlet, but blues were reported from Hatteras Inlet to Oregon Inlet with fish being caught at ramp 49, 43 and as well as on Ocracoke Island.

Of interest is the fact that on a recent cobia sight casting trip Sharon and I took last week off Cape Point in Buxton, our Captain cast to what we thought was a school of drum. At once the fish turned and chased the lure and we hooked up a 12 plus pound blue. Sharon landed an 80 pound cobia which she whipped into shape in about fifteen minutes. The fish had to be double-gaffed and it was boated. We fished with Captain Kevin Clark, one of the most avid cobia fishermen I have ever fished with.

I always thought I was as good at catching sea mullet as anyone on this beach, until the other day. I was fishing with Sharon and her friend Ashley and I have enough of a problem trying to stay ahead of them, but the three of us were frankly 'taken to school' by a couple fishing just to the north of us at ramp 38. Conditions were perfect, a light northeast wind, warm water of good clarity and thousands of sand fleas. Armed with my usual double-dropper loop rig with two Bear Paw flicker hooks tied on, baited with sand

fleas, we dropped our baits just off the shore break into the water. With little hook-up success and just a few hits and misses, we were watching the couple north of us hook up every minute or so, hooking and landing large fish on unmanned rods set in sand spikes. We were holding our rods and getting no bites. This couple was fishing six rods from sand spikes and were landing fish on all rods with more than one multiple hook-up. The more we watched, the worse it became. They landed over six state citation sea mullet and a state citation pompano. I could stand it no longer. They were in a better place, but we were close enough to them and location should not have been a problem. So, I walked up and introduced myself. The angler was Ernie Hughes, #19422, and his lovely wife Judy. They said they normally fished ramp 23 but, due to closures, had found the 'hole' they were fishing in. I then asked what he was fishing with and he told me a double bottom rig made with dropper loops and finished with No 1 sea circle hooks...no beads, no spinners, just bare hooks baited with sand fleas. He also used

a 2 ounce round sinker and was fishing right off the drop-off.

Armed with that information, I ran back to my truck and tied three rigs using a khale hook since I had no small size circle hooks. Bating up, we continued and started catching, not as good as the Hughes, but we caught 17 nice sea mullet and two of the fish were just short of being citations. We returned the following day with the Hughes already in place and caught just a few fish between us all.

Ashley returned today (June 16), armed with circle hook rigs and blistered the fish, catching one citation and about 15 more fish which she gave to the Hughes who had also returned for a third day at the beach.

Summary: double dropper loops tied from light line (25 or 30 pound test, flora-carbon line for a real sneaky advantage) with No. 1 sea circle hooks baited with sand fleas, a lightweight, round sinker and fish close in. Thank you Ernie and Judy!
