I have also accepted the resignations of Direc-tors Mark Burbic & John Cavins due to changes in their employment schedules not allowing them


the time to participate. This leaves the present BOD short 2 members and they are all working extremely hard taking on the tasks required to keep your Association moving forward in the

seconded. Motion passed.

Director Rod Palmer reported on June's OBR and the Adopt a HWY clean up had a total of 26 volunteers and was an overall good turnout for the summer. Director Palmer also requested to come up with a new bumper sticker design and getting them ordered. He also touched on the small OBR white trash bags for the vehicles and the pro's and con's of them but would check on ordering them or another type that might be a better choice with the NCBBA logo and web address on them.

Nothing to report on fishing tournaments, youth awards or fishing citations due to Director Mark Burbic's absence. The board brought up to drop the expiration date off the fishing citations. Di-rectors were asked to check their assigned tackle shops for any citation forms that they might have for process.

Vice President Tom Burke's report on business practice was that he will keep everyone up to date on any practices that are set forth and he is here

to help anyone in any way he can.

There hasn't been anything to report on Junior Membership so it was put before the board to see if anyone wanted to tackle the situation. Director Palmer volunteered to try to get the program back on course. Using the merit badge awards for the youth as they volunteer for events was a suggestion for Director Palmer to use

Director Mike McNichol reported that the newsletter is just one week behind schedule but newsteter is just one week betimen schedule but everything is ready to go to print. On fundraising Director McNichol is looking into using several different ways members might want to donate to the Legal Funds. One way would be Electronic Funds Transfer system enabling members to have a regular monthly donation drafted automatically. Another way Director McNichol suggested was for members to add the NCBBA in their wills or as a beneficiary on life insurance policy's for a small

percentage of the proceeds or if a member had or has assets that have appreciated substantially and would take a hit on the capital gains then they might want to consider donating these assets to a Charitable Remainder Trust with NCBBA the

beneficiary.

Issues before the board will be handled by VP Burke and these issues are the Red Drum Tourna-ment, getting more memberships, USF&W critical habitat lawsuit and from finding a volunteer for Jr. membership to thanking Director Rod Palmer

Past Pres. Jim Keene reported on the DEIS, CHAPA and Critical Habitat. DEIS is in the hands of the NPS and they have until the end of the year to come up with the EIS (Environmental Impact Statement) in which everyone will have a chance Statement) in which everyone will have a chance to comment on it and everyone again will be asked to do so. On July 13th, a meeting is scheduled between Jim Keene, Larry Hardham, David Scarborough with David Vela, Regional Director of the NPS. Mr. Vela will ultimately be the one who will sign off on the parks ORV plan.

On the Critical Habitat lawsuit our lawyers have filed papers in the suit and hopefully we will hear a response from the indee in this case in the not

response from the judge in this case in the not

so distant future.

Complaints about the DEIS are the fact that Traditional Cultural Properties as per NEPA have been fully ignored. Mike Murray's response is that he is appointing someone to head up a demographic study of the seashore. As of this time no one from the Hatteras Island Community has been contacted about this study. This is a study to be done with what is called the original descendants and the effect this will have on them.

On the Building of the Bridge issues NCBBA has shown full support in this. Public comment meetings are scheduled. The building of the bridge

is being fought by the Audubon. The bridge plan we are supporting is the short bridge. An alternative form of transportation for beach goers has also been discussed. No one from any of our supportive organizations has been included in these meetings. So it was requested from War-ren Judge that someone be chosen to be present

## Intrusions

We are entering an era when intrusions into our personal freedoms are increasing. These intrusions effect both individuals and businesses. Freedom is steadily diminishing because of intrusions from government, activist courts and special interest groups.

On the national level, we have recently seen

our government force out the head of General Motors, a shareholder owned company. We have

also seen the government attempt to dictate the salaries of executives and interest rates charged by public companies. Our government seems determined to intrude into all aspects of our lives. They want to make the decisions for individuals and businesses and intrude even further into other individual freedoms.

Evidence of this intrusion into freedom is

evident on the Outer Banks of North Carolina. In

2008, a small group of well-funded "environmentalists' filed a lawsuit in Federal Court against the National Park Service seeking to restrict access to the Cape Hatteras National Seashore Recreational Area. The enabling legislation designating this area as the first National Seashore, promised public access and recreational use for all time

Because of the lawsuit, the citizens of Dare County, where most of the recreational area is located, were forced into a Consent Decree that severely restricted access to key portions of the area. Either it was accept the Consent Decree or risk having a Federal Judge completely close the beach.

By filing the lawsuit, these "environmental-ists," the majority of whom do not live in or near this area, intruded into the rights of others. They challenged not only the Park Service officials, but also the many dedicated volunteers who have faithfully guarded sea turtle hatchings from natural predators and participated in bird census monitoring. These "environmentalists" decided, in absentia, that they could better protect the wildlife in our area than the Park Service and local residents and visitors who have a vested interest in assuring that area wildlife will be here for generations to come.

The Consent decree has penalties for entering an area quarantined to protect birds or turtles. In addition, it has draconian penalties for violations that do not directly involve wildlife. For example, if vandalism occurs to a sign, the quarantine area is automatically extended by 50 meters. For each subsequent act of vandalism, the quarantine expands even further. Instead of prosecuting those who broke the law, the Consent Decree punishes the law-abiding residents and visitors. This is yet another intrusion into freedom.

Our Country was founded by those who fough and died for the freedoms we all currently enjoy. Since the very beginning of our Republic, many have suffered and died for the cause of protecting these freedoms. Public access to public lands is an important issue everywhere people value freedom. We are appealing to all people of goodwill to join in our fight to preserve open and accessible beaches on the Outer Banks of North Carolina. For information about the history of the Cape

Hatteras National Seashore Recreational Area and how you can help, please go to our website www.PreserveBeachAccess.org. Remember by supporting our struggle, you may help prevent ar intrusion to freedom from happening to public lands in your area.

# **Editorial**





Fundraising for beach access is a critical part runtiansing for beach access is a critical part of our organization's plans to fight over zealous environmentalists who are intent on shutting down access to the Cape Hatteras National Seashore Recreational Area. We cannot match dollar for dollar the spending of some of these nationwide groups. Audubon for instance has over \$300 million in the bank including \$20 million from Toworta just last year.

million in the bank including \$2.0 million from Toyota just last year. You may ask what we do with our funds? This year we have spent thousands of dollars to fight National Fish and Wildlife's designation of large areas of the Seashore as "critical overwintering habitat" again for piping plovers. We successfully sued several years ago but lost this time around, which means that at its discretion it can close large areas even in the winter.

Court fights are expensive so we have taken a

new tack in the fight with the release of Piping Mad a short documentary about beach access. If you have not viewed this please do so at NCBBA. org. This is an effort to show the plight of the people of Hatteras Island and generate wider involvement from the general public. This was made possible by a most generous grant from "The Bob and Jean Schonk Charitable Trust".

In my capacity as Director of Fundraising, I will he exploring several avenues to generate income for your organization. I am currently exploring the use of EFT (electronic funds transfer) to facilitate small contributions on an automatic monthly ba sis. A contribution of a few dollars each month of combined with other members could have a huge impact on funds available for beach access. If you may have an interest in doing so please let me know at editor@NCBBA.org. This would not be of interest. Your Board of Directors would then

of interest. Your board of Directors would men be able to make an informed decision on benefits versus expense of such a program. Another tool widely used by universities, chari-table organizations, churches etc. is the Charitable Remainder Trust. In simplistic terms, here is how it works. If a person holds a highly appreciated asset for example a home/rental property, a trust can save considerable tax dollars. Let's say the property was purchased in 1980 for \$100,000 and is now worth \$1 million. If the home were sold at value he/she would owe the IRS roughly \$200,000 on capital gains. Instead of selling it, the property could be donated to a Charitable Remainder Trust. The trust would sell the property tax free for face value and the proceeds placed in the trust from which the seller would draw a lifetime income

with any remaining balance going to the charity named in the trust. There are many variations of this arrangement so a trust can be specifically designed to meet an individual's needs. The *Piping Mad* documentary is an example of the use of Charitable Remainder Trusts and will soon be

developed to a full-length format for broadcast.

This is becoming a more national fight by the day. We need to actively pursue every avenue so that your grandchildren and mine have the right to access these beautiful beaches in the future. In addition to our own funds and those of Cape Hatteras Anglers Preservation Association and Outer Banks Preservation Association we have received a commitment for \$10,000 from the New Jersey Beach Buggy Association. They realize that this fight may come to their shore in the near future. Their help is greatly appreciated.



# Fishing Report

#### by John Newbold #14



At last my favorite time of year is at hand, and until Igor came along, fishing was just great! Light wind blew from the northeast, finger mullet had started their annual fall run, and puppy drum were biting! Most every trip to Oregon Inlet would produce a fish or two, but this fall the best bite has

been on the incoming tide rather than on the falling tides we experienced last year.

On my best day so far, I landed a 32-1/2" fish, only to be bested less than ten minutes later by a 34-1/2" fish my wife, Sharon, caught! If you want your 'fishing feelings' hurt, ask her to go fishing with you, and get ready for a sacking!

Bait of choice is fresh finger mullet, either chunked or filleted. I always scale the fish prior to cutting up the bait. It releases the scent and is easier to push onto the hook. The head of the mullet is the choicest piece to use since smaller fish cannot steal it off the hook. I recommend hooking the heads

choicest piece to use since smaller has cannot steal it off it nook. I recommend nooking the neads from beneath the lower jaw up through the head with the hook clearly exposed.

Many folks fish a single hook using the carolina rig, or sliding sinker arrangement. I prefer to tie a double bottom rig using 40 or 50 pound line, tying two dropper loops into the line. I then affix two circle hooks. I like a size from 1/0 to 40 and have had more bites and hook-ups using bait I filled tather than chunked. I feel this is because the fillets release more smell than chunks, and with two baits in the water, I up my odds 100%!

batts in the water, I up my odds 100%!

Puppy drum fishing is not rocket science, nor does it require a great long-distance cast to reach these fish. Year after year in tournaments, more women catch puppy drum than men because they don't cast as far out as men do. I am not saying women cannot cast, they can! What I am saying is that, in general, men tend to throw as far as they can, for whatever the reason...maybe a hormone thing! Anyway, the point is, these fish come very close to shore to forage and let the waves stir up things for them to eat. The fish will root around in the breakers that edge a slough, or break in the outer bar. When you find a nice 'hole' or slough, the temptation is to fish the middle of the hole. Avoid the temptation, fish the edges to the north and south of the hole and you will catch fish! Change baits often. I usually change baits every ten minutes or so expecially when fishin he lay layer filled edge. often. I usually change baits every ten minutes or so, especially when fishing bait I have filleted since these baits tend to wash out rather quickly. When fishing the beaches from Corova to Buxton on the east-facing beaches, a hard northeast

wind will produce the best results, while beaches south of Cape Point require a southwest wind for

These fish are very powerful, and on the hook-up if you are using circle hooks, lift the rod up smartly and begin to reel. Do not jerk the rod to set the hook. All you will do is pull the fish off. During the fight, go right to the water's edge and move up or down the beach, keeping the fish in front of you. By standing still and letting the fish run out to the left or right of you, you stand an excellent chance of losing your catch. Use the waves to ease your fish in rather than tug and pull against a receding wave. The fish will turn and run, many times freeing istelf.


