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President's Corner

The fight for reasonable vehicular beach access has entered a dark new chapter now that the final rule is out and the outrageously priced (\$120.00 per calendar year & \$50.00 a week), hard to obtain permit structure has also been made public. You, the taxpaying American Citizen faces many challenges in dealing with this plan. Very little changes were made from the FEIS to the Final Rule. The public comments were virtually ignored. The Final Rule is 82 pages long. 59 of which explain why your comments were ignored. How the National Park Service sees the future of vehicular beach access is far different than how the NCBBA Board of Directors (BOD) and membership sees it.

After 5 years of continued meetings, public forums, public comment periods & 2 years of being a member of the Negotiated Rule Making Committee, we have had enough! The National Park Service totally ignored the visiting public while all the time bowing to the wishes of Audubon & Defenders of Wildlife. The release of the ORV Final Rule showed their total disregard for humans and seeks to turn Cape Hatteras National Seashore Recreational Area (CHNSRA) into a bird sanctuary. On February 9, 2012, Cape Hatteras Access Preservation Alliance (CHAPA) filed a legal suit against the DOI, NPS, and CHNSRA asking the court to declare that the NPS acted improperly and illegally and to provide permanent injunctive relieve to prevent NPS from implementing the plan. The suit challenges the National Park

Service's (NPS) issuance of a new management plan and special rule regulating off-road vehicle (ORV) use at CHNSRA. The lawsuit seeks to prohibit NPS from imposing severe new restrictions on ORV use within the Recreational Area in accordance with the agency's recently released Cape Hatteras ORV Management Plan/ Final Environmental Impact Statement and Special Regulations governing ORV management at the Recreational Area.

Since before the establishment of the Recreational Area, ORV access to and over the beaches of North Carolina's Outer Banks has been fundamental to the use and enjoyment of the area by residents, visitors, and local businesses. "The Park Service's new ORV management plan and rules, if implemented, will have a devastating effect on our unique, local shore-oriented culture and economy," said John Couch, President of the Outer Banks Preservation Association (OBPA). "The NCBBA, OBPA and CHAPA have fought to keep the CHNSRA beaches free and open to residents and visitors since 1977. NCBBA, OBPA and CHAPA continuously have maintained that reasonable ORV access and bird and turtle species protection are not mutually exclusive. Unfortunately, the Park Service overlooked reasonable recommendations and information that NCBBA, OBPA and CHAPA put forth during the planning process that would have resulted in an ORV management plan and rules that both protect wildlife resources and ensure reasonable ORV access to and over the area's beaches.'

Throughout the ORV planning and rulemaking process, CHAPA's goal has been to work with NPS to develop a comprehensive ORV use and management plan that will meet the concerns of protecting the Recreational Area's resources without compromising the distinctive lifestyle and economic health of the islands that make up the Outer Banks. CHAPA has advocated the protection and preservation of Seashore beaches within a framework of responsible and meaningful access to the ocean beaches and sound for all users, including pedestrians and properly licensed drivers and their vehicles.

According to the complaint filed by CHAPA in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia, the imposition of new, severe restrictions was "foreordained from the time that NPS began its planning process." As set forth in the complaint, the Park Service's planning and environmental review process under the National Environmental Policy Act was plagued by a series of failures. These include, among others: a failure to give meaningful consideration to views, data, or information that were contrary to NPS desire to impose more severe restrictions on ORV access and use; a failure to look at reasonable alternatives, including smaller and more flexible buffer and closure areas; and a failure to properly assess impacts on the local economy. The complaint asks the court to determine that NPS acted improperly and to prevent NPS from implementing its final ORV management plan and rules.

In discussing the recent events Jim Keene, representing NCBBA added, "Mechanical access

to the beaches predates the creation of the Recreational Area by over 100 years. The horses and wagons of the eighteen and nineteenth centuries were followed by the model T and ORVs in the twentieth century. The success of this legal action will insure that the historical recreational traditions and culture of the Outer Banks will endure for future generations.

NCBBA continues to fight for you the mem-

bership & the visiting public!

Now more than ever NCBBA needs your financial support! We have been frugal with your donations and membership fees by doing most of the legwork ourselves with Jim Keene and a small group of dedicated CHAPA volunteers. Legal fees are expensive, usually around \$550 an hour. This lawsuit will cost at least \$150,000.00! With the NCBBA annual memberships running \$25 and renewals \$20 per year, the bank account can be drained quickly if we aren't careful. Several of you have been generous with donations and we hope this will continue. Your BOD will spend every dollar NCBBA has to fight this travesty, but we will not spend it foolishly.

As your President, I ask for your trust and support. Now more than ever all access minded individuals need to stand together. This is not the time for finger pointing, second guessing or throwing in the towel. (This is why I made the decision to run again for President.) We are all working hard for access. The NCBBA BOD and CHAPA volunteers are working very hard to protect what we believe is rightfully ours.

In Support of Vehicular Access

Over the last 60 days many of you have asked questions related to the complaint filed by CHAPA in the US District Court, Washington, DC. The Recreational Access Team Members at CHAPA, NCBBA and OBPA have developed this list of most frequently asked questions and answers:

Frequently Asked Questions:

1. What do you expect to gain by this lawsuit; NPS will still do as they please?

•We need to force the NPS to write an ORV Management Plan that will provide for continued free and open ORV access to the recreational beaches while maintaining programs for reasonable resource protection.

- 2. Why do we need an ORV Management
- Two (2)-standing executive orders (signed by Presidents Nixon and Carter) require an ORV Management Plan for any DOI facility that allows "off road vehicle driving"
- 3. What is wrong with the Plan issued by

- While there are errors and multiple excesses. in "the Plan" we find some of the most objectionable excesses occur in the unfounded Vehicle Free Areas, the night driving ban, seasonal and resource buffer (closure) areas, the extreme and unreasonable size of seasonal closures.
- 4. Why do we have to pay so much or anything at all to drive on the beaches, I have never paid
- · Like so much in "the Plan" access fees of \$50-\$120 are excessive and do little but support the NPS facilities and personnel who man them. We often proposed an alternative using an Internet available permit at a minimal cost. The Park Service implemented the plan/rule on February 15 and we have to buy permits if we wish to drive on the beaches.
- Any modifications to NPS's implementation plan for the Rule in the meantime, including fees, will be at their discretion.
- 5. Why did CHAPA not ask for a preliminary injunction to stop the implementation? Are they

more difficult to obtain?

- CHAPA believes the errors in the NPS process identified in the complaint are of such magnitude that modifications to correct the current rule during a temporary injunction are not feasible and that the Court should issue a permanent injunction.
- 6. Has the case been assigned to a judge?
- Case 1:12-cv-00219 Assigned To: Sullivan, Emmet G.
 - Location: Washington D.C.
- 7. What will happen next as the case proceeds?
- The defendants have 60 days to respond to the complaint at that point, the court and counsel for the plaintiff and defendants will establish the process to resolve the complaint.
- 8. Why was Murray named individually?
- The defendants are the officials in charge for the three agencies named in the suit, Salazar for DOI, Jarvis for NPS, Murray for CHNSRA.
 - 9. Who is funding the Suit?

- The Plaintiff is CHAPA, a project of the OBPA CHAPA is funded through voluntary public dona tions. (NCBBA is a major donor to CHAPA and a participant in establishing policies.)
- 10. What cost and use does the ORV rule

to the beach. When a specific beach area reaches 260 vehicles or if the area is deemed unsafe NPS will close that area to any more vehicles until the beach is in compliance.

- Permits apply to any vehicles on National Park Service property including all sound side trails.
 - 11. Where can I get an ORV permit?
- The Cape Hatteras Lighthouse Visitor Center (Buxton),
 - The Ocracoke Visitor Center. (Ocracoke)Coquina Beach Visitor Area (Bodie Island)
- Coquina Beach Visitor Area (Bodie Island)
 Open daily except Christmas Day, from 8 a.m.
- to 4:30 p.m., with expanded hours on weekends and holidays during the summer season
- Those applying for permits will watch a seven-minute educational video on operating an off-road vehicle on the beach and the seashore's

ORV regulations. And they must bring a driver's license and vehicle registration with them.

- Permits are fixed to the lower driver's side exterior of the windshield
- Failure to abide by the ORV regulations are a Federal offense, subject to fines, arrest and revocation of the permit.
- 12. Will the ORV Rule still be in effect while CHAPA's legal complaint is pending?
- Yes, the court ordered "consent decree" officially ended Feb 15, 2012 when the new ORV Rule came into compliance.
- 13. Is it true all the inlet areas and south beach at Cape Point are closed permanently to ORV Access?

An Island's Economy Put At Risk

Recent actions by the National Park Service and the North Carolina State Legislature have created a perilous situation for the economy of Ocracoke Island.

The NPS has implemented a Fee to drive on the Beach. Historically there has been no fee. The State Legislature has mandated by way of the 2012 Budget that the State Ferry System generate 5M in revenues, a large part of which will come from the Cedar Island and Swan Quarter Ferry Runs to Ocracoke. These two ferries are the primary traffic arteries for traffic to the Island from the south as well as the west

Coupled with higher than normal gas prices, a continuing high unemployment rate and the always present risk of a storm; it appears a "Perfect Storm" condition maybe developing for the small Island and its 800 plus permanent residents? The Tourist Economy drives the well being of its Inhabitants whether they be Waitresses, Lodging Owners, Restaurant Owners, Retail Shop Owners, Ferry Workers or Commercial Fisherman.

It seems the National Park Service Management and the North Carolina State Legislature have not given due consideration to the economic impact their mandates may cause? The very existence of Ocracoke Island as it is today maybe at risk.

An example of the impact of the proposed increase in Ferry Tolls and the imposition of the Beach Access Fee is as follows:

Assumption:


Family of Four comes to Ocracoke for a 2 night weekend stay. They plan to spend quality time on the beach by way of their Family Owned SUV/4 Wheel Drive. They travel the Sound Class Ferry as to access to Ocracoke (Cedar Island to Ocracoke). They are coming from southern North Carolina so driving around by Hatteras (the free ferry) is not an option. It would increase travel time by some 5 to 6 hours. This is prohibitive for a weekend/2 night stay.

The historic cost for the Ferry Ride (two ways) has been \$15 each way for a total of \$30. There has been historically NO CHARGE for Beach Access. The cost to the Family for the new NPS Beach Access Fee is \$50 for the two day beach outing (this is the minimum fee). The cost for the Ferry ride is proposed to be \$47 each way (\$27 for the vehicle and \$5 for each passenger); for a total ferry cost of \$94. Total cost for Ferry and Beach Access being \$144 for the two night/two day beach access stay. The increased cost for the Weekend Outing is \$114 being \$144, up from \$30 last year. This is a 480% increase.

While it is recognized that the Government must increase revenues or reduce services in these dire economic times, it should not be done without considering the consequences to a small community completely dependent upon Tourism. The Citizens, Property Owners and Businesses of the Island all are at risk. The NPS and the North Carolina State Legislature should revisit their increase in charges giving consideration to the potential loss of one of the National/State Treasures; Ocracoke Island and its Citizens as we know it today.

Bill Cochran's Outdoors: Less freedom at Hatteras for surf casters





My first beach vehicle for surf fishing the Outer Banks of North Carolina was a Chevy Blazer that I purchased new in 1971. I equipped it with wide, non-aggressive tires and made a rod rack to mount on the grill. It gave me the mobility to traverse a ribbon of white sand so close to the edge of the continent that in three or four leaps from the Blazer's blue door I'd be knee-deep in the Atlantic.

Before I got my own vehicle, I rode with Bob Preston, a fulltime guide, and a good one. He could have spent his golden years in the rolling hills around Fincastle, where his ancestors settled, but he chose Nags Head as therapy following two heart attacks, cancer and a lifetime of fortunes made and lost. Bob was slim, and his weather-beaten face was even gaunter when he removed his false teeth, which he did while fishing.

He detested bluefish, revered speckled trout and was so good at red drum fishing that his skills were the subject of a feature in Sports Illustrated when he was 66. He was a master at pinpointing sloughs that held red drum in water so rough you wondered how they survived, much less fed. If a school of speckled trout hit the surf, Bob was on

them in an instance.

For a time, Bob had a World War II surplus Jeep he used as a beach vehicle. Later he owned a 4-wheel drive Toyota with a transmission that made so much noise it was difficult to talk above the growl. And Bob loved to talk. He was a master at filling the lulls between bites with intriguing stories, some of them true. If Bob couldn't put you onto fish, he had a knack of making it appear to be the fish's fault, not his.

At that time, Nags Head was a village of rustic houses on stilts. The year-round population was less than 400. You stayed at the Carolinian Hotel, not just because it was nice, it was the only

The bridge over Oregon Inlet was yet to be built, which meant the last ferry of the day had more to do with ending a fishing trip than the lack of bites.

That's how it was 40 years ago, when life was simpler.

Beginning Feb. 15, the hundreds of beach drivers using the national seashore will be required to watch a seven-minute educational video and

purchase a permit that will cost \$50 per week or \$120 for an annual pass.

The permit and other requirements are part of new rules by the National Park Service to protect wildlife and the environment along the 67-mile seashore. Some 26 miles of beach will be off-limits to vehicles

Environmental groups, including Defenders of Wildlife, the Southern Environmental Law Center and Audubon North Carolina, laud the new regulations, but they are a bitter pill to many anglers

Bob Eakes, who owns the popular Red Drum Tackle Shop in Buxton, said the park service rules

are a tremendous challenge for his business. "I just don't know if I can stay in business," he told the Virginian-Pilot in Norfolk.

Anglers have lost a good bit of freedom on this deal. It makes you wonder if the time will come when the only fishing on the Outer Banks will be pier fishing. Gone will be the joy of feeling the force of the sea come surging at you, sucking the sand from beneath your feet and tossing salt mist into your face. Jones asks park service to change Hatteras Beach signs

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Today Congressman Walter B. Jones (NC-3) conveyed his concern over new signs that have been erected by the National Park Service (NPS) in Cape Hatteras National Seashore Recreational Area. In a letter to Mike Murray, Superintendent of the National Park Service Outer Banks Group, Jones points out that the signs falsely convey a level of restricted pedestrian access that goes beyond park laws and regulations. He goes on to ask the Superintendent to replace the signs.

The full text of Congressman Jones' letter to Superintendent Murray follows:

'Dear Superintendent Murray:

I am writing to convey my concern with new signs the National Park Service (NPS) has erected in several locations along the beach in Cape Hatteras National Seashore Recreational Area. I have attached a photograph of one of the signs for your review.

The signs falsely convey a level of restricted pedestrian access that goes beyond park laws and regulations. They read: "Shoreline Open to Restricted Pedestrian Access: Leave no footprints behind. Walk in water where footprints wash away." However, the recently enacted final rule explicitly allows "pedestrian shoreline access along ocean and inlet shorelines below the high-tide line . . . in front of prenesting areas until breeding activity is observed.'

Clearly, these signs do not reflect the level of accessibility permitted in the rule. The rule's allowance for visitors to walk below the high tide line does not mean that visitors can only walk in the ocean.

The final rule is already hurting Seashore visitors and nearby residents and businesses enough.



They should not have to deal with additional restrictions not included in the rule. I urge you to promptly remove these signs and replace them with new signs that accurately convey the level of visitor accessibility spelled out in the final rule. If I can be of any assistance in securing this change, please do not hesitate to let me know.

Ferry Tolls

FERRY TOLLS

The Hyde County Department of Public Information today had some bad news for Ocracokers and visitors to that island about increasing ferry tolls -- or taxes, as they are being called.

The legislature had ordered the N.C. Department of Transportation Ferry Division to raise more money on the state's tolled ferry routes.

The governor tried to head off the increases with an executive order prohibiting the increases for at least a year.

Lobbyists from McClees Consulting, hired by Hyde and several other counties to head off the tolls reported today that the state's Attorney General sided with the legislature on the ferry tax issue during his report to the N.C. Joint Legislative Transportation Oversight Committee.

The Chief Deputy Attorney General wrote the

"It is, therefore, our opinion that a direct conflict between a law enacted by the General Assembly and an Executive Order issued by the Governor must be resolved through implementation of the law.'

Now, ferry riders must prepare to pay the increased tolls, which will cost a family \$104 for a round-trip ticket on the Swan Quarter ferry. It's just \$30 now. In Pamlico and Beaufort County, commuters are facing a tax of \$100 per week just

"It isn't good," said Hyde County Manager Mazie Smith. With the tolls initially set to increase April 1, she worried the costs could soon become a reality and advised Hyde department heads to

The county manager also pointed out residents on Hyde mainland who don't even ride the ferry will still have to pay the price for the ferry tax. Smith estimated the increased tolls will cost the county of Hyde an extra \$60,000 in travel costs for government business. These extra costs will have a direct bearing on county jobs, programs and services.

Hyde is urging its citizens to get ready to march in Raleigh.








In addition the big drum have been making some appearances near the point when we get a good southwest wind. Puppy Drum are also beginning to show in scattered numbers from Ocracoke to the point with southern Ocracoke the early favorite. Flounder and Pompano will

My old friend "River" advises that at least one Cobia has been caught along the buoys outside Hatteras Inlet and netters are beginning to see a few also. By late this month or early May the "brown suits" should begin to arrive in good numbers in Hatteras Bight.

The northern beaches are still fairly quiet as the Labrador Current still has the upper hand on water temps although there are some Puffers north of Oregon Inlet along with the usual skate and dogfish catch.

Offshore boats out of Hatteras and Ocracoke have found good catches of Wahoo and many boats

Lawsuits and **Bulletin on Jones Bill**

LAWSUITS

This is the week that the federal government was to respond to a lawsuit filed on Feb. 9 by the Cape Hatteras Access Preservation Alliance, seeking to overturn the Park Service's new ORV plan and final rule.

CHAPA filed the suit in federal court in the District of Columbia against the Department of Interior, the National Park Service, and the Cape Hatteras National Seashore. It asked that the Secretary of Interior Ken Salazar and his folks go back to the drawing board and come up with a plan that allows more reasonable access.

As of mid-afternoon, no response had appeared on PACER, the federal court website.

David Scarborough, a spokesman for the Outer Banks Preservation Association, said he spoke vesterday with CHAPA's Washington-based lawyer, who also expected either a response or a request for an extension by today.

We'll check back with PACER the first of the week.

And for those who are wondering what is happening with the lawsuit that environmental groups filed to stop the plan to replace the Bonner Bridge with a new span parallel to the current one, the answer is "not much of anything."

Defenders of Wildlife, National Audubon Society, and the National Parks Conservation Association, represented by the Southern Environmental Law Center, filed the lawsuit last July against the Federal Highway Administration and the N.C. Department of Transportation.

A check of the PACER federal court website shows mostly procedural filings since then.

Most of the filings this year have concerned the administrative record of the decision to build the short bridge, which is apparently a gazillion

megabytes. The plaintiffs, the defendants, and the courts have gone back and forth on how physically this information will be put in the public record of the case.

When DOT produced the administrative record, the plaintiffs claimed that it lacked key

It will likely be months before this lawsuit moves forward in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of North Carolina in New Bern.

BULLETIN ON JONES BILL

Just as I was finishing this blog, Joshua Bowlen, legislative aide to U.S. Rep. Walter Jones, R-N.C., called to confirm that HR 4094 will get a hearing before the House Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands on Friday, April 27, at 9 a.m.

HR 4094, introduced by Jones in late February is called The Preserving Access to the Cape Hatteras National Seashore Recreational Area Act and would return management of seashore resources to the Interim Protected Species Management Strategy and Environmental Assessment, issued by the Park Service on June 13, 2007.

In a media release, Jones said the bill would "restore reasonable pedestrian and motorized access" to the seashore

Bowlen said the bill be discussed with several other federal land access issues.

The chairman of the committee, he said, is U.S. Rep. Rob Bishop, R-Utah.

Bowlen said a list of the witnesses that will be called to testify has not been finalized yet.

The hearing will be streamed live on the U.S. House of Representatives website, and Island Free Press will follow up with a more complete story next week.
