Access to the Point takes a Tern....

After enjoying 660 days, (less one for ordinance disposal), of continuous ORV access to Cape Point a colony of Least Terns has taken up residence in a location where mandatory buffers make it necessary to close access. We recognize Cape Point as the "Old Faithful" of Cape Hatteras National Seashore Recreation Area and when it is closed it has a great deal of impact, emotionally and realistically for fishermen, shellers, and those who just wish to take in that most dynamic venue on our east coast. Your present and immediate past BODs inherited a very good access

situation due to the incredible hard work of previous BOD members and affiliated

pro-access groups and individuals.
Our own NCBBA president Jim Keene was a tremendous advocate and spent countless hours and personal sacrifices in working with OBPA and others while becoming one of the foremost experts on challenges and intricacies of the situations that led to the closure of much of our beaches. Without going into those factors beaches. Without going into those factors or the daunting task of fighting for fair access, and without listing all of the access advocates for fear of leaving out some

who, like Jim, sacrificed much on our behalf; I will tell you that the battle was partially won when legislation tied to the National Defense Authorization Act included S-486, Preserving Public Access to Cape Hatteras Beaches Act. This occurred at literally the same time our current NPS Hatteras Group Superintendent Dave Hallac was departing his position in Yellowstone to take over his new position in Manteo.

In the three plus years since this transition, Dave Hallac has worked with a number of local groups and individuals, including your past and present NCBBA directors, officers and members, to reduce some of the previously excessive buffers, improve physical access to a number of areas within our park and apply some adaptive management measures in trying to comply with S-486. While doing this he has kept his word to do his best to make the visitor and resident experience good for all who wish to enjoy CHNRSA while maintaining the required resource protection. That was his message day one and remains his message today. Those of you who are familiar with the current NPS staff have noticed that they are here to please

That being said, we whom you have chosen to represent NCBBA, along with a number of others from OBPA, CHAC and

more, continue to work to try to obtain more area and hours of access. The rules that currently govern such things as buffer zone sizes and duration, currently responsible for the closure at Cape Point, are subject to challenge as is the "best available science" that created them. In fact, Dave Hallac is currently working with Gordon Myers, Executive Director of the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission to specifically analyze the impact of ORV traffic on colonial water birds. The study is in the planning stages with intentions to schedule in 2019.

Because of the dynamic environment of our "sandbar" the challenge is also dynamic with today's solution not working

namic with today's solution not working tomorrow. The current situation at the Point may well be created by the development and subsequent merging of Shelly Island to the Point. While on the surface it created a greatly desirable and expanded area, it also created many additional acres of that broad flat beach adjacent to the tid-al line that some of our feathered friends consider ideal for nesting opportunities, regardless of limited fledging success in past history. The fact is that recent heavy rains may, ás I write this, be making access to Ramps 44 and 49 impossible had they



President's Corner

The Point

On Saturday, May 19, a portion of Cape Point was closed. Nesting Least Terns along the south side created the need for a resource protection closure. The closure, which originally protected twelve nests (those numbers have increased significantly since this article was written), will likely remain until late July.

Everyone from NCBBA to the National Park Service, to every fisherman and guest who loves The Point is disappointed the closure was necessary. Are we surprised? The answer would be "no". The dynamics of Cape Point and the merger of Shelly Island created a wide, favorable nesting area. This was not the situation last year when The Point was a narrow spit of land and overrun with visitors to Shelly Island.

NPS Superintendent Dave Hallac and Gordon Myers, Executive Director of the North Carolina Wildlife Commission are planning a study to further qualify the size of buffer zones which may enable more adaptive management and adjustments to closures. The study, focused on Colonial Water Birds, looks toward a longrange plan that in turn could have a positive effect on resource management.

Your NCBBA Board will continue to work with the National Park Service, as

well as other access groups, always with a goal of maintaining and improving access to our beaches.

The Annual Meeting
This year's Annual Meeting was a tremendous success. The crowd of over 200 people enjoyed the new venue at the Beach Klub in Avon, the excellent food, fellowship and the outstanding entertainment. NPS Ranger Josh Ruzanski brought us up to date on the beaches, while Tommy Farmer provided the necessary fundamentals to help us all improve our casting.

It was great to see so many old friends, along with so many new members and first-time attendees to the event. One of our raffle winners (of a new rod and reel) had been an NCBBA member for a week

not been raised 24" and 36" respectively as part of the access improvement plans. Be-tween, and including Ramp 2, at Bodie Is-land to Ramp 72 on Ocracoke Island there have been several improvements to both ocean and sound side access. We would like to see more access to Oregon Inlet via Ramp 4 and removal of the seasonal clo-sure of Ramp 23 in the future. The limited area accessible from Ramp 4 causes many to make a longer drive down Hatteras Island than they may wish and the seasonal closure of 23, my personal favorite, puts more pressure on the newer Ramp 25. The Point is likely to remain closed to

ORV access until sometime in August. It is accessible by foot should you choose to walk there while keeping your feet in the water through the closure area. We're not happy about this situation but hope that,

for your sake and that of the businesses that serve us on Hatteras, the closure of .4 of a mile does not keep you from using the 25 miles plus of beach that is still ORV accessible. On a personal note I thoroughly enjoyed Hatteras Island for over 20 years before first visiting Cape Point in 1995. I'm not saying that you should feel the same but must say, coming from greatly restricted beach areas on our northeast coast, to this day I am thankful for the legislation that created CHNSRA and prevented it from becoming an overdeveloped nightmare. While keeping in mind what has been lost on Hatteras Island, and continuing to fight for any and all access gains that we can make, I am grateful for what we do have and will always appreciate and enjoy it.....hoping that you will as well.



Fishing News

Well the current news is the Cobia bite that has been outstanding as of late, even including the surf fishermen at the Cape Point area along with some days at Ramp 38. Many have been surf caught, with most undersized having to be released, but Kara Eakes at Red Drum Tackle tells me that wasn't so with Wayne of central North Carolina. Seems he had been fishing for two days in a boat at Hatteras Inlet and having no luck, decided to walk out to the Point and promptly lands a whopping 96 lb. Cobia on a squid stripped bucktail. Kind of hard to one-up that story. Way to go Wayne! By the time this report is hitting the street, most everyone will know that as of 6-1-18, only one Cobia per day per boat. Guess if you're surf fishing everyone in your party can keep one, but don't take my word for that. The Spanish Mackerel have been put-

ting quite a show on too, lately. Lot's of limits are being had, with a good run of 2-4 pounders at the Point the 3rd week of May. You can pretty much mark your calendar each year the last week of May and the 1st week of June for this sporty fish. Of course, we expect them around most of the summer.

Sea Mullet are biting in good numbers as well, with several citations landed in Ramp 43 area, and I'm sure they are catching more in less popular areas. If you look at area reports, they're included at all areas of the island and the north beaches above Oregon Inlet. Pompano are starting to be a

targeted fish as their numbers are heating up. Typical of Pompano, there has been several citations among the early scouts, one was brought in at the member/guest tournament of Nags Head Surf Fishing Club last week that weighed 2 lb.13 oz.

Channel Bass, wow, hasn't gotten a mention until now, but thankfully they're still biting almost anywhere you can put a line in the water. Back of Oregon Inlet, all along the sound the whole length of the island are being sight cast landings of all sizes as well in the surf in the suds. As a lifelong resident here, I've never seen drum fishing as good as it is all year. I've also said this statement the past 5-6 years to boot. Speaking of drum, at the recent Ocracoke Invitational Surf Fishing Tournament in early May, Kevin Jacobs of the Surfside An-glers was relegated to the beach because of a mild stroke a couple of months prior, forced to watch his teammates out on the bar catching small blues and sea mullet, when a 43" drum jumped his bait in the slough. Teammate Casey Copeland told me he saw the drum roll and then noticed Kevin was bowed up and yelled to the others to get their lines out of the way. Needless to say, it was the fish to propel them to the awards ceremony reaping 1st place prizes. To cap it off, it was his birthday.

Good 'ole tuna belly.
I could ramble for hours, but I'm heading for some Spanish waters this afternoon. Remember to always help keep the beaches clean, trash can be picked up and possessed at any time, with no limits.

TOURNAMENT RULES

1. Official entry form (Anglers Species Report) must be presented when submitting a fish to a tourna-

- 22. Fish must be measured & verified by on-duty Tournament Official to qualify for entry.

 3. All fish caught on 10/25 must be registered before 11:59 P.M. on 10/25. All fish caught on 10/26 must be registered by 11:59 P.M. on 10/26. All fish caught on 10/27 must be registered by 12:00 P.M. on 10/27. Angler must be registered when the fish is caught. No fish can be entered after 12:00 P.M. on 10/27. Exception: If fish is hooked prior to 12:00 P.M. the Angler may land the fish provided judge was called before 12:00 P.M.
- 4. The Co-Chairman, Head Judge or NCBBA may cancel the complete tournament or any portion of the tournament if circumstances such as bad weather arise. If the complete tournament is cancelled before it begins, a total refund of entry fee will be made. Once the tournament begins, no refunds
- 5. All fishing will be governed by IGFA, state and federal rules and regulations.6. The Co-Chairman or Head Judge reserves the right to disqualify any fish of suspicious nature that
- 7. All Anglers will display their fishing gear for examination to any Tournament Official on request. Anglers are limited to 4 rods, per licensed fishing person, that you may actively fish. Do not use unattended rods to take up beach area.
- 8. Keep the beaches clean no bait scrap or carcass to be thrown in ocean or left on the beach.
- 9. Judge cellular phone numbers, provided at tournament, will be used for tournament communications and emergencies only.
- 10. No nets or gaff may be used by Anglers. No use of boats or other flotation devices may be used for placing baits. No assistance allowed in casting or landing of fish. This is a catch and release tour-
- for placing baits. No assistance allowed in casting or landing of fish. This is a catch and release tournament except Bluefish and Mullets.

 11. Anglers will need an area working cellular phone. If a judge does not answer, please call roaming judge or closest ramp judge in your vicinity.

 12. Surf fishing only, feet must be on the sand. No sound-side fishing. Anglers must only fish in designated beach driving areas. The judge must be able to drive to you in order to score the fish.

 13. All measurements will be determined by TAIL LENGTH. In case of a tie, first measured fish wins.

 14. All Anglers must have a current NPS Off Road Vehicle (ORV) permit to drive on NPS beaches; available at the Rodio or Cape Nathers in Judge and online.
- able at the Bodie or Cape Hatteras Lighthouse and online.

 15. All Anglers must have a valid NC Saltwater Fishing License; available at most tackle shops

Don't Drill NC

At NCBBA's board meeting on April 21,2018, one of our members, Mike Fahey, #11580, requested time from the Board to make a presentation on behalf of the NC Coastal Federation regarding the group's efforts to oppose DOI's Bureau of Ocean Energy Management [BOEM] plan to set aside the current 2017-2022 offshore oil exploration plan, and replace it with a far more aggressive program to run from 2019-2024. NCCF's campaign to offset that effort is called Don't Drill NC, and information about it can be found at dontdrillnc. org or by contacting NCCF's regional office in Wanchese. As with any actions or rule changes that may impact our beaches or adjacent waters I think that it is important that everyone who lives on, visits or cares about our coasts and surrounding water

be informed about the regulations and changes that may impact those areas.

Currently, BOEM is planning to offer nearly 78 million acres of offshore waters for gas and oil exploration and development in the Gulf of Mexico region as part of President Trump's America-First Offshore Energy Strategy. The first sale is scheduled for August 15, 2018 with subsequent sales planned through 2022 including the Midplanned through 2022 including the Mid-Atlantic area. That area would be subject to a 50 mile buffer from the coast in the 2017-2022 plan. There are currently new Executive and Secretary's Orders directing BOEM to develop a new Outer Continental Shelf plan that would take effect from 2019 through 2024 and, in addition to other factors, may alter buffers. As with any exploration and development there are inherent risks which need to be weighed against the national security benefit of energy independence and the actual immediate need for additional resource.

Ryan Zinke, Secretary of the Interior, has recently stated that he will be announcing more relevant informa-tion about the intentions of the DOI in the very near future. Should you wish to learn more about the program from the DOI viewpoint I suggest that you may wish to visit www.boem.gov for Proposed Notice of Sale and other information regarding the program. We all have an opportunity to make our feelings known on program and whichever side of the issue you may choose, I hope that you can take the time to be more informed

Virginia State Police Clarify Location of ORV Sticker
